What's the connection between individual and collective memory? Can collective memory suppress an individual one? Who tells us what to remember and what to forget? What makes history?

Within the context of theatre and its fictional nature 5 actors from different regions of Ukraine and Poland explore common and personal pasts and memories through their individual experiences and histories of their countries.

For the authors of the show it's important to expose not only the social-political mechanisms, but also theatrical ones. Especially that in the theatre the past and

memory are expressed though fiction, which always wants to be taken as reality. Can the stage – a space of fictional characters and events, illusions, which we want to believe in – become the place where we can explore the mechanisms of memory and our complicated relations with the past?
