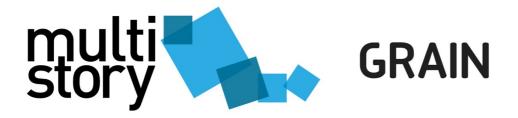

Nicola Shipley, Director of Grain Projects. Nicola will speak about her practice on the *Photography, Ethics and the Community* panel.

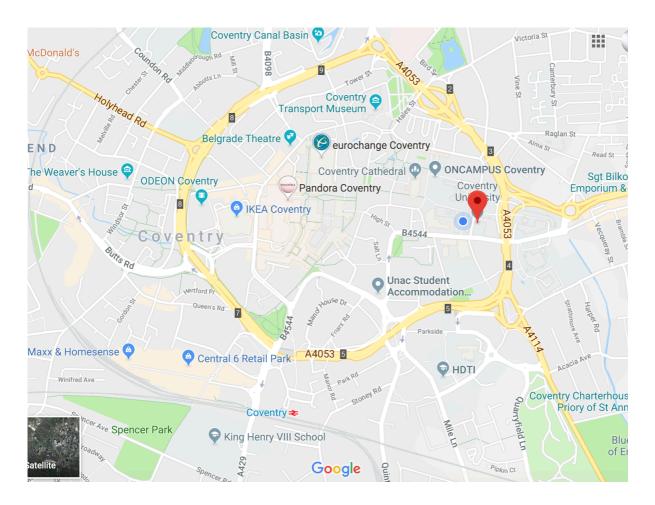
Damian Sutton (Dr), Professor of Photography Theory and Culture at Coventry University. He is the leading the 'In Conversation' with Anthony Luvera.
