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



# WHAT WE PUBLISH AND WHY?


- An interdisciplinary academic/creative journal

MAI welcomes a variety of submissions from strict, scholarly register to a more experimental or avant-garde approach to analysis. A selection of best feminist writing and creative work is published bi-annually via this website (The Journal). We operate a full peer review process that is subject to external review by at least two independent reviewers. Submissions are first assessed by our managing editor and then reviewed further by subject specialists. Articles are only published if recommended by two peer reviewers, by both co-editors-in-chief and the managing editor.
