











Detrempe 1 Packet Flour 1 the water teaspoon Snet Butter Flour pard liberally + flow rolling pin.

FISH SOUP

- 1. 10 onions
 - 5 heads of garlic
 - 10 large carrots
 - 2 whole celery
 - 5 bulbs of fennel
 - 2 large bouquet garni
- 2. 15 large frozen red mullet
 - 5 large Mocc. tomatoes
 - 10 tablespoons tomato puree lib. frozen prans in hells
- 3. liquid to cover ingredients/half fish fumet half water sea salt and cayenne 10 large potatoes saffron threads(about 10)

Sweat all the ingredients in part one once sliced in olive oil, until soft but not coloured. Add the ingredients in part 2. mix, cover pan and sweat until the tomatoes start to soften. Add liquid, cayenne, diced potatoes and saffron. Bring to the boil and then simmer for 1 hour. Pass through a mouli or liquidise, adjust seasoning, adding salt and black pepper.

²²⁸ Celine Marchbank *Shot in Isolation*

> When Celine Marchbank contracted Covid-19 ahead of the first nationwide lockdown, she began exploring her home for a subject that felt worth photographing. With spring unfolding, it was the flowers she picked from her garden and allotment, placed in little pots around her house, that caught her attention. For Marchbank, these plants encapsulated the bittersweetness of that strange, uncertain period when the world came to a halt; a time of bulk-buying and communal panic. Cast in a soft evening light reminiscent of 17th-century still-life paintings, Marchbank portrayed her delicate blooms in varying stages of wilting and decay. They are symbolic of her acute awareness of both her own and the world's mortality: 'We were being bombarded with the language of death constantly. Every day we were talking about how many people had died and how many people were in hospital. I was interested in how the flowers reflected that in some way. I noticed that each day the flowers were slightly more aged, more petals dropped. And in that weird atmosphere, it was the only visual way of noticing time was passing.'

The process of making these photographs was therapeutic for Marchbank; it gave her a routine and brought consolation, beauty and joy in a time of gloom. Flowers are a common thread throughout her work – they serve as a point of connection to her late mother whose love for nature and gardening also runs through Marchbank's veins. 'My work is a lot about emotions and feelings: it reflects the time and mood that I'm going through. I was interested in the idea that things were still ticking away during the lockdown, even though the world very much felt at a standstill. It made me feel hopeful.'


